BRIEFING THE ADMINISTRATION AND PLANNING

The Administration, P.T.A and Staff were briefed by exhibiting the proposed program planned during Training. The School really appreciated the exposure of the school to International program concerning PWID. The community further admired the inclusion of PWID in the community and Job placement to enable them live independently and be productive members of the society.

ACTIVITY 2-SEPTEMBER TO DECEMBER 2011

The school was scheduled to host a one day Training workshop and plan to develop a Training program whereby skilled human resource in Tailoring Aongola Mukatimui, Carpentry and Joinery Caesar Kasimba and Production Unity Abigail Zulu were Identified to facilitate the programs. Due to examinations this program was to be done early this year. Mrs.Tembo a member from the community has volunteered to teach PWID learners in Level 4, 5 and 6 in Bead work where the learners were taught in the afternoon of every Thursday.

An Intellectually Impaired Community Based Individual has continued his effort to provide prevocational services to the rest of the learners with Intellectual Disabilities.

Chipembi College of Agriculture where PWID are Trained has been identified and The Administration is very grateful to Learn about this program so that the Learners can be accessed the needed skills for life.

The school has plans to tour this college to familiarize itself together with pupils and one or two P.T.A. The Learners with Intellectual Impairment have been referred to this college to per sue their training in vocational skills in Agro Farming for the next intake.

Individuals who have potential to develop this program have asked for this Action Plan:

Mr. Nakatali who has a Child with Intellectual impairment has equally demanded for this program. Actually this parent is running Tailoring School whereby he has agreed to incorporate these PWID in the program.

The Education Standards Officer Special Education for Kazungu District has shown interest in this program.

ACTIVITY 3 JANUARY-SEPTEMBER, 2014

Implementation to be administered during the course of the year as funds are being sourced to Develop room a workshop where the PWID will be trained in vocational skills as it expand to provide Grade 8 and 9 classes for the Visually and Hearing Impaired learners.

Mrs. Ketty Chiluka has been singled out to teach Home Economics to the Intellectually Impaired learners so that they acquire special skills in this learning area.

To assess the ability of these learners a demonstration maize field was planted where children in level 1, 2, and 3 participated fully.
